Drill performances are one of the most impressive displays a Corps can provide. They demonstrate discipline, coordination, teamwork and dedication. The drill performance can be done with or without commands. The advanced drill manoeuvres add to the dynamics of any performance.

Drill, how well it is executed, and the level of difficulty in the manoeuvres is often how the civilian public judge any military or paramilitary organization. It is important to remember that NOT EVERY cadet at this level will be able to execute the advanced drill manoeuvres. Choose the ones most suited to this type of drill.
